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
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

### Main professional interests

Sharing of new ideas, imagination, intuition, innovation.

This factor refers to a desire to create, imagine, innovate, develop concepts, and make them real and concrete. People with a high score on this factor tend to avoid routine and conformity. Their minds are creative, and they are original and intuitive.

#### 3 - THE COMMENTS

#### An interpretation of the score on each factor

Given below are the personalised comments for the 12 factors evaluated. These factors are derived from the 6 dimensions of the RIASEC model. For example, the dimensions of "Hands-on knowledge" and "Outdoors" fall under the "Realistic" dimension of the RIASEC model. Recognising the candidate's main interests should enable them to better understand their aspirations and professional potential.

However, it is possible that their current job does not give them the opportunity to take full advantage of these potentialities. Therefore, they should not hesitate to use this analysis to help them target activities (of leisure or other social activities) that will allow them to develop their full potential.

#### Definition



<u>Values</u>: Beauty, originality, imagination and freedom.

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
